**Treasurers Report –**

Operations Account – \$ 2,454,496.58 Capital Account – \$ 1,104,734.49, Total – \$3,559,231.07  
At 30%, right in line where it should be at.

It was motioned by Davis and seconded by Fagel to:  
'Accept the August 2019 Cash Balances and Budget vs Actual Reports'

Roll call vote – Motion carried

**Expenditures –**

Chase Checking – \$338,701.22, Chase HRA – \$2,328.66, Total expenditures – \$341,029.88

It was motioned by Fagel and seconded by Guddendorf to:  
'Approve the Expenditures for August 2019 in the amount of \$341,029.88'

Roll call vote – Motion carried

**Consent Items –**

EMC - \$1,619.20 – Repair maintenance on hydraulic tools and power units  
Zoll - \$2,386.42 – Blown mother board on cardia monitor  
MES - \$13,375.00 – Turnout gear

Discussion was held on checking into extended warranty for the monitors.

It was motioned by Fagel and seconded by Cicero to:  
'Approve the Consent Items for September 2019 in the amount of \$17,380.62'

Roll call vote – Motion carried

**Trustees Report** – Trustee Fagel provided Chief Pekins a copy of a COOP Plan that he created for the village over 10 years ago, to be used as a sample/format.

**Report from Chief and Command-**

Monthly report is in packet to Trustees.

August – 97 calls, last August – 109 calls, 30 calls above for the year.

Director of Tri-Com resigned effective 10/03. Question concerning if this will affect responses – should not. Discussion held on rumor of consolidation.

**Attorney's report** – Governor signed House Bill 2766 – establishing a peer support program for all first responders, focusing on suicide prevention. We are required to offer an EAP.

Chief stated we had one officer go to Peer Support Training – he will check to see if she is certified.

Naden case – tentative date is scheduled for 09/30.

Trustee Cicero questioned what Shawn knows about pension reform – Flaherty stated that the task force the governor formed should have something next month to look at.

**11a)** Discussion of and Possible Action on Master & Capital Improvement Plan – Fagel handed out information he would like to have seen in the plan; one area being showing community growth. Guddendorf stated the plan should be approved and then it can be added to it as an ongoing plan.

‘Approve the Master & Capital Plan as presented by Chief Perkins’

**12a) Re-Appointment of Fire Commissioner** – Ross Scimeca’s 3-year year term is up, he would like to be considered again for commissioner.

Roll call vote – Motion carried

**12b) Surplus Property** – there is a dry erase/ bulletin board cabinet that has not been in use for many years, that is taking up space in a closet.

It was motioned by Fagel and seconded by Davis to;

‘Declare the dry erase/ bulletin board cabinet as surplus’

Roll call vote – Motion carried
